Subject: Workforce Development - New Program for Hiring CDL Drivers

Connecticut Employers: You Need Commercial Drivers – We Have Them! Be part of the driver shortage solution

The Entry-Level Driver Training and Employment Program (ELDTEP) provides wage subsidies for on-the-job training and support for eligible CDL program graduates. The program is designed by employers to help meet the critical need for a skilled transportation workforce.

In partnership with local driver training schools, ELDTEP targets entry-level drivers who have obtained a CDL license but lack significant commercial driving experience. Drivers must reside in one of 57* towns and cities in the Greater Hartford area, and meet income and other WSCMH eligibility requirements. Participating employers will be reimbursed 30% of a new driver's salary (up to \$18 per hour, 40 hours a week) over an 8-week period.

The ELDTEP program is an initiative of the Transportation, Distribution and Logistics (TDL) Workforce Partnership and is managed by the CBIA Education and Workforce Partnership with funding from the Workforce Solutions Collaborative of Metro Hartford (WSCMH).
