*Northern & Central N.Y.*



The Lovell Safety Staff has developed safety training materials in various formats to meet your specific needs.

Cost matters. Effective safety training is an important loss control tool. It aids in the prevention of injuries which may result in costly claims and it ensures regulatory compliance thereby avoiding expensive fines.

Every Lovell group member is assigned a dedicated safety professional who understands the challenges that group members face. Our safety staff does not function alone, they are supported by a team of safety professionals, with varied expertise, who are able to respond to any safety and health situation. Through our on-site surveys and consultations, we develop specific training programs that address the potential safety and health exposures at your organization.

We provide these training programs in various ways depending on your unique operations. Our goal is to provide optimal effective training with minimal disruption to your business. This includes scheduling, location, and training format.

In addition to providing the highest quality safety training, our seven experienced full time safety professionals are out in the field on a regular basis, visiting our group members, evaluating working conditions, and helping them to develop and implement effective safety and health programs.

All of the Lovell safety department services are at no additional cost to our group members.

Written Safety Talks

The Lovell safety staff does the research and the writing. We have currently created over 60 different talks to meet your needs. Safety talks of 5 to 10 minutes should be held by superintendents and/or foremen as often as possible, at a minimum weekly. Employees never receive too much training, and therefore we rely upon jobsite management to provide ongoing and continuous employee training. The subject of each safety talk should be chosen to relate to the type of work that is being performed.

Safety Alert

Group members automatically receive copies of the Lovell Safety Management—Safety Alert. This is a periodic newsletter packed with useful and up to the minute safety and health information. We include industry-specific safety updates, recommendations for controlling specific hazards; OSHA/PESH policy and standards changes and any other relevant safety and health news that our group members need to keep up to date on the information that may affect their organization and employees.

Online Safety Training

The Lovell safety staff has created YouTube safety and health training programs that can be streamed on computers and mobile devices. Short safety talks and longer compliance oriented programs are available.

On-Site Safety Training

All of our safety representatives are trained and experienced professionals that can provide safety training at your facility. We also provide the OSHA 10-Hour Construction Safety class on a regular basis. This is offered at convenient locations throughout New York State at no additional cost to group members. We develop safety programs to meet your unique needs. Some of our more popular programs include:



OSHA 10-Hour Outreach - Construction

This is a two-day, 10-hour program provided by our OSHA authorized instructors. Those who attend will receive a wallet card from the OSHA Training Center. In addition to complying with the regulation, this course offers your personnel an excellent understanding of the specific safety and health hazards found on a typical construction work site.



Hazard Communication - GHS

This training program provides an overview of the requirements of the standard, basics of safe chemical handling and a thorough review of the Safety Data Sheet (SDS).



Fall Protection

This course covers the proper safety procedures relating to both active and passive fall protection, the proper selection, inspection and use of personal fall protection equipment.



Scaffold Safety

The objective of this course is to help both employers and workers work safely on scaffolds and comply with regulatory standards.



Fork Lift & Pallet Jack Operations

Employees are trained in the safe operation of a powered industrial truck as per OSHA requirements. This includes a written and driving assessment. Certificates and wallet cards are issued upon successful completion of the course.



Lifting Safety

The employee learns proper lifting techniques and how to adapt them to each unique job situation. The anatomy of the back is discussed so the employees will understand “why” they need to lift properly and the potential consequences of performing an improper lift.



Behavioral-Based Safety Management: Why do People Get Hurt?

To be successful, safety initiatives need to address employee and management behavior and motivation. This program relates basic theories of motivation and the ABC theory of behavior to injury prevention. Different versions of this program are developed depending on the target audience.
