Subject: Minimum Wage by State

Below is a state-by-state table, which reflects the current minimum wage, as well as future increases. The NRLA would like to remind you that as the minimum wage increases, employers need to update their required minimum wage posters. Required posters should be clearly displayed somewhere apparent to all employees on a daily basis, such as a break room.

State/District	Current Minimum Wage	Future Enacted Increases
Connecticut	\$15.00 per hour	\$15.69 effective January 1, 2024 as a result of the state's first-ever economic indicator adjustment
Delaware	\$11.75 per hour	\$13.25 effective January 1, 2024 \$15.00 effective January 1, 2025
Washington, D.C.	\$17.00 per hour as of July 1, 2023	Increases occur in July; see the <u>Dept. of</u> <u>Employment Services</u>
Maine	\$13.80 per hour	\$14.15 effective January 1, 2024 <u>based on cost-of-</u> living index for the Northeast Region
Maryland	\$13.25 per hour (>15 employees) \$12.80 per hour (<14 employees)	\$15 effective January 1, 2024 <u>regardless of</u> <u>number of employees</u>
Massachusetts	\$15 per hour	None; 2023 increase was "the <u>final of a 5-year deal.</u> Further increases must be approved either by the legislature or by the people via a ballot question."
New Hampshire	\$7.25 per hour	<u>N/A</u>
New Jersey	\$14.13 per hour	\$15.13 effective January 1, 2024, <u>\$13.93 if fewer</u> than 6 employees
