Regulatory Update: Drive Green NJ & Advanced Clean Trucks (ACT)

- NJDEP's Drive Green NJ initiative entails <u>a number of programs</u> designed to reduce greenhouse gas emissions from automobiles. These include a sales/use tax exemption for zero emission vehicles, charging grants to offset EV charger purchasing/installation costs, and a statewide EV infrastructure partnership.
- In 2024, New Jersey introduced <u>multiple new grants and programs</u>, including \$249 million under the EPA's Climate Reduction Grant Implementation program, \$15 million annually for electric school buses, the New Jersey Fleet Advisor, and the eMobility Planning Toolkit.
- In 2021, NJDEP <u>adopted</u> the Advanced Clean Trucks (ACT) Rule, which requires manufacturers to sell zero-emission trucks as an increasing percentage of their annual sales from 2025-2035.
- As of October 2024, the Rule applies to any manufacturer that produces on-road vehicles over 8,500 pounds GVWR manufactured in model year 2025 and on sale in New Jersey after January 1, 2025.
- As in California, only true emergency vehicles <u>are exempt</u> from the requirements of New Jersey's ACT Rule. Manufacturers, <u>not dealers or operators</u>, are responsible for complying with the new requirements.
